

The Platform for Electromobility statement on the Renewable Energy Directive Recast

Strasbourg, 17 January 2018 - The <u>Platform for Electromobility</u>, which gathers 30+ businesses and associations promoting electromobility, commented on the outcome of today's Parliament plenary vote regarding the Renewable Energy Directive Recast:

"Both the Parliament's and Council's texts have acknowledged that electric cars and trains have higher efficiencies than fuel-based vehicles, this creates a level playing field between renewable electricity and other advanced renewable fuels. However, the provisions put forward by the Parliament and Council are still insufficient to promote the growth of renewable-based electromobility solutions. This is especially the case regarding the transport targets - fuel supplier obligations, as suggested by the Commission, would have enabled the achievement of a higher renewables share in transport - including renewable electricity - accelerating a cost-effective decarbonisation of the transport sector. The replacement of harmonised fuel supplier obligations with national targets for renewable energy is a missed opportunity for the EU"" said Giorgia Concas, Chair of the working group Energy Policy of the Platform for Electromobility.
